



# PARTICIPANTS IN LEARNING, LEADING AND SERVING

The Participants in Learning, Leading and Serving (PLLS) is a Grand Canyon University program that is designed to benefit teachers, students, parents and leadership of public district schools through alliance scholarships, university program discounts, professional development and more.

## PLLS OUT-OF-STATE STUDENTS RECEIVE:

- **SCHOLARSHIPS.** Out-of-state high school students graduating from a PLLS participant high school, who are fully admissible to GCU, will receive a minimum institutional award package of \$3,250 per academic year. The total GCU award package could increase based upon a student's level of academic merit, program of study, registration date and other offers for incoming students, including those related to participation in athletics, pep band, theatre, debate, etc.
- **DUAL ENROLLMENT.** PLLS high school students have an opportunity to reduce the time to complete a bachelor's degree from four years to three by taking dual enrollment courses during high school. These courses are offered at \$52.50 per credit hour.

## PLLS STAFF AND SPOUSES RECEIVE:

- **SCHOLARSHIPS.** Staff receive a 10% scholarship providing savings toward tuition and fees for online undergraduate, graduate or doctoral degree programs along with non-degree single courses and continuing teacher education courses. Spouses receive a 5% scholarship. A 15% scholarship is available to PLLS participants employed as paraprofessionals and classified employees entering an online Bachelor's program through the College of Education or a secondary education emphasis degree program.
- **PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT.** Access to GCU's Canyon Professional Development services and applicable discounts, including expert-led professional development, coaching, mentoring, consultation and strategic planning. All fee-based services are specifically customized to meet the needs and goals of our PLLS participants.

## ADDITIONAL BENEFITS:

- **JOB BOARD.** Access to the GCU Online Job Board to post employment opportunities and search for applicants.
- **DISCOUNTS.** Discounts available to students and staff for a variety of events and camps held on campus.
- **Other benefits** may be available as needs and programs are determined.

Effective tuition rates would not exceed \$13,250 per academic year after the minimum GCU scholarship package is applied.

The high school must be a PLLS participant on or before Aug. 1 immediately following the student's graduation in order for the student to be eligible for the \$3,250 minimum award.
